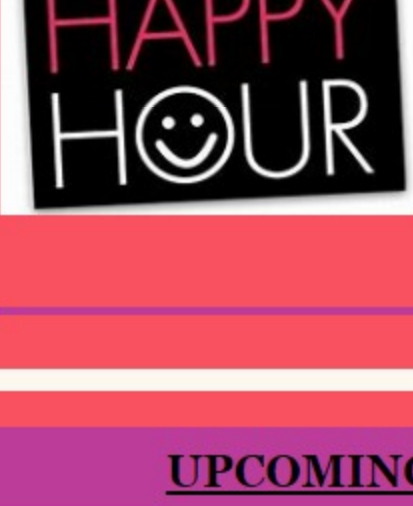
BWC Premium Installments:

Brightside Project Named a Rite Aid KidCents Charity
Rite Aid Foundation Awards \$2 Million in Grants to 2019 Charities

SALEM, OHIO — Local charity The Brightside Project was named a 2019 KidCents Charity by the Rite Aid Foundation in January 2019. Across the country, 416 charities will each receive a \$5,000 grant to improve the health and wellbeing of children. This includes Salem's Brightside Project.

"We are so thrilled to be a recipient of Rite Aid's generosity," Lisa Wallace, Co-Director of The Brightside Project, said. "Their dedication to providing funding to organizations such as ours is vital in our outreach efforts. As we move in our mission to equip and empower children to reach their full potential, this funding will give us the opportunity to house a permanent food and clothing center that will directly benefit children in Columbiana County. We are looking to open our facility in 2019 to meet the needs of the community."

The 2019 class includes 146 charities who are participating in the KidCents program for the first time. The selected charities' programs encompass a wide variety of projects that advance children's health and wellbeing, promote academic growth and support a safe environment to live and grow.

"We feel grateful that the Rite Aid Foundation recognized the good work that The Brightside Project is doing," Wallace said. "We are a young and growing organization, which makes this honor even more special."
